#### **About Our Schools**

The first public school in Merrick, founded in 1901, was a one-room building which housed 38 students and one teacher. The district now consists of three elementary schools with a total enrollment of approximately 1,500 students. Children receive their secondary education in the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District, which serves the communities of Merrick, North Merrick, Bellmore and North Bellmore. Two members of the Merrick Board of Education serve on the Central High School District Board.

#### **Mission Statement**

The Merrick Union Free School District will provide students with the opportunity to maximize their potential and to become lifelong learners, independent problem-solvers and responsible citizens by working with all members of the Merrick community to create learning environments that support students' social, emotional and academic needs.

#### **New Residents**

New residents who are parents of school-age children should register their children as soon as possible at the appropriate elementary school. If you have questions about where to register, contact the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Business, 516-992-7260.



### **Kindergarten Registration**

Children who are registered for kindergarten must be 5 years of age on or before December 1 of the school year of entry. Registration is held in February of the year preceding entrance into kindergarten, and parents are notified by mail of registration dates. Official birth certificate is required. Proof of immunization as well as a full physical examination is required prior to the start of school.

### A Firm Foundation for Learning

Merrick's public schools offer a diversified educational program with exciting learning opportunities at all grade levels. By offering the most current educational technologies and strategies, while emphasizing our commitment to basic skills, we provide students with a firm foundation upon which all higher-level learning can take place.

Teachers and administrators work together on districtwide committees to review and develop curriculum in each discipline to meet state and district goals. From science to art, technology education to language arts, mathematics to music – Merrick's rich and varied curricula reflect this thoughtful planning process, which helps provide our children with a complete, well-rounded educational experience.

**Experiential learning** is at the core of Merrick's instructional program, with hands-on learning opportunities for students at all grade levels in all subject areas. The curriculum includes four major components: language arts (reading, writing, listening and speaking skills), mathematics, science and social studies. Instruction in the basic skills provides a foundation for learning now and in the future, while enrichment opportunities help to broaden students' horizons and extend learning boundaries. This is accomplished through the guidance and leadership of a talented, caring faculty, administration and staff – committed to the best for our children. A strong emphasis on character education is integrated throughout the school day.

### **Partners in Education**

The Merrick School District welcomes and encourages the involvement of parents in their children's education. Our Parent Teacher
Association (PTA) provides us with generous and consistent support, which enhances the social, educational and cultural resources at each
of our schools. In addition, our PTAs are in touch with our legislators and help keep us abreast of new legislation that has potential impact on the community. Parents,
teachers and administrators work together through the PTAs to create a richer environment for children. We urge all parents to become members of these important

## **Parental Involvement in the School Program**

**An open house** is held at each school at the beginning of the school year. Parents visit the classrooms, meet teachers and receive an overview of curriculum, homework policy and academic expectations.

**Parent-Teacher Conferences** are held twice during the school year, providing an opportunity to discuss your child's strengths and weaknesses. Parents receive report cards indicating the performance and effort made by children in curriculum areas. If a parent has a specific question about his or her child's education, inquiries should be directed through a specific line of communication:

- 1) The teacher or other appropriate staff member
- 2) The building principal
- 3) The Deputy Superintendent
- 4) The Superintendent
- 5) The Board of Education

All **visitors and volunteers**, including parents and guardians, must call the school to schedule their visit prior to entering the school. In the event of an urgent situation, please call the main office before your arrival at the school. All visitors will be required to provide a valid federal or state-issued photo identification which will be scanned into the visitor identification system upon entering the building. All visitors will receive an identification badge from the greeter which must be worn at all times. After receiving the badge, the visitor must report directly to the main office. While in the school building, visitors should remain in the area designated for their appointment. No one will be permitted to visit other parts of the building (e.g., stop into a classroom or cafeteria, visit another office).

**Homework** is a vital part of the school's total curriculum. The actual experience of completing homework assignments independently is what is of value. Homework is given in a number of different forms, and may be given for completion overnight or for an extended period. The purposes of homework are to reinforce and apply concepts introduced in class, to develop the habit of working and learning, to develop a sense of responsibility, to develop sound organizational and study skills, and to provide a sharing of learning experiences between parents and their child. Parents can assist by providing a specific place for the student to work, free from distractions, encouraging the establishment of a time schedule for homework completion, and by showing interest in homework assignments.



## **An Environment Conducive to Learning**

The philosophy of the Merrick Public Schools is to help all children develop their fullest potential to the greatest extent possible, so they can take their place in society as productive, well-adjusted, responsible citizens.

In accordance with the requirements of the State Education Department, the Merrick School District established a Code of Conduct designed to promote responsible student behavior. The Code of Conduct includes student rights and responsibilities, and a dress code, along with a range of disciplinary procedures, consequences and procedures for the resolution of discipline problems. The Code of Conduct is explained to all students on an annual basis. Copies of the Code of Conduct are available in each school office for review and on the district website. An emphasis on character education is evident throughout the district.

We have a strong commitment to ensuring that Merrick Schools are **drug-free and weapons-free schools**. Drug and alcohol possession or use is not permitted at our schools or school events.

Regular **attendance** is important to the learning process. While it is recognized that children learn from many sources, the classroom learning environment is a key ingredient in the success of students. State education law defines a legal absence as sickness, sickness or death in the family, impassable roads or weather, religious observation, religious instruction (up to one hour per week) or presence in court. If your child is going to be absent, please call the school nurse. A note explaining the cause of absence, or any lateness, is required when the child returns to school. In the interest of safety, if a child is to be released from school at a time other than dismissal and/or if an adult other than the parent is to take the child from school, prior written notification is required.

The district has recognized a number of **days of religious observance** throughout the year. These days are listed in the school calendar, marked by the symbol (DRO). Students may be excused from classes with a note from their parent or guardian.

## Serving the Whole Child

#### **Student Services**

In addition to its full instructional program, Merrick provides extensive support services to help meet the needs of our students. The Assistant Superintendent for Student Services supervises these programs which include special education classes, resource room services, placement of students with disabling conditions, psychological services, speech and hearing services, testing, social work services and health services. A Committee on Special Education oversees the program of each child receiving special education services, and a Committee on Preschool Special Education oversees the identification and provision of services to children who require special education services prior to their entry into kindergarten for students ages 3-5. Individuals wishing information about any of these services can contact the Assistant Superintendent for Student Services at 516-992-7293.

## **Child Find**

Consistent with Part 200 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, please notify the Student Services Office at 516-992-7293 if you have a child up to 12 years old with a suspected disability who may require special education services. All information is kept confidential.

### **Summer Instruction**

A Summer Instructional Program is offered to children who need assistance to maintain academic gains made during the regular school year. Daily instruction is provided over a five-week period in areas such as reading, writing and mathematics.

## **Summer Recreation**

A five-week Summer Recreation Program is offered to children who will be entering grades K-6 the following fall. Open to the children of district residents, the program meets Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and offers experiences in art, physical education, music and drama. Registration and fee information is posted on the district website in late winter.



## **Before/After-School Programs**

In response to the needs of Merrick's many working parents, the District provides space at each school for both Before- and After-School Programs. These programs are operated by the Merrick Before/After School Program (BASP) which has been providing quality school-age child care service to the children and parents in the Merrick U.F.S.D since September 1982. The Merrick Before/After School Program Inc. (BASP) is an independent, not-for profit organization governed by a Parent Board of Directors.

The Before-School Program is in session at each elementary school in the district and is open on all school days from 7 a.m. until the start of school. There is a minimum of two days participation per week. Parents must bring their child or children into the school and sign them in each day.

Important Note: In the event that there is a delayed school opening due to inclement weather (e.g., snow or ice, etc.) the Before-School Program will be closed. Parents will be notified by the school district whenever there is a delayed school opening.

The After-School Program runs daily from 2:55-6 p.m. at each of the three elementary schools in the district. Time and assistance are offered for completion of homework assignments. Students are also provided with a variety of supervised activities, which include arts and crafts, physical education and computers. Snacks (milk and cookies, etc.) are provided daily to the students. Children must attend a minimum of two days per week. Parents must pick their children up no later than 6 p.m. and must sign them out each day. ## FERPA (The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act)

Consistent with FERPA, and with certain exceptions, the Merrick School District cannot release personally identifiable information from a student's educational records without a parent or guardian's written consent. However, "directory information" may be disclosed, typically by way of a districtwide or school building publication, without written consent unless a parent or guardian provides written objection to the building principal. The Merrick School District has designated the following information as directory information: name, address, telephone listing, grade level, photograph and video image.

#### **Student Photos**

The Merrick School District has designated student photographs and video images as "directory information" pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). As a result, parents/guardians who do not want their child's photograph and/or video image utilized by the school district or its employees in district publications, news outlets and/or social media sites, should send written notification to the building principal advising the school district that they do not consent to the use of their child's photograph and/or video image in district publications, news outlets and/or social media sites.

## **Transportation**

Students who live over 1/2 mile from school are eligible for bus transportation. Busing is also provided for students who attend nonpublic schools located within 15 miles of the child's home. State law requires that parents annually file, prior to April 1, a written request with the Business Office for nonpublic school transportation.

## **Safety First**

We want our students' ride on Merrick school buses to be a pleasant and safe one. Parents are urged to be sure their children understand that disorderly behavior is extremely dangerous on a moving bus. Children must remain seated and obey the driver.

## **Bus Safety**

- Cross 10 feet in front of the bus, waiting for the driver's signal to cross.
- Never cross behind a bus.
- Keep head and arms inside the vehicle at all times.
- Remain seated until the bus comes to a full stop.
- Enter and leave the bus only when it is completely stopped.

Some of our students walk or ride bikes to school, with their parents' permission. Each school has bike racks where children can chain and lock their bikes. Residents should be particularly alert to our young children during the hours of arrival and dismissal from school. Remember, the safety of our students is a cooperative effort on the part of the community, parents and drivers. Let's all work together to make this a safe year for Merrick students.



## **Health Policy**

Beginning in the 2017-2018 school year, the district implemented modifications to the regulations associated with the student health services policy. To increase food safety, particularly for children with food allergies, these regulation changes were adopted by the Board of Education during the 2016-2017 school year.

Specifically, the regulation (Student Health Services 5075) outlines the following:

#### **Celebrations and Parties**

Celebrations for birthdays, holidays and other special events will focus on acknowledgement of the student(s) and the significance of the event. Foods will not be permitted at celebrations with the following exceptions: Peace and Friendship Day and the Sixth Grade Picnic. For these two events, the selection of foods must include options that are free of target allergens so that all students may be included in the celebration.

#### Snacks

Snacks brought from home are for personal consumption only. Students will only eat food from their home or a parent-approved, school-supplied snack. Students will receive instruction about allergy awareness. Teachers will discuss with students, in an age-appropriate manner, the seriousness of life-threatening allergies and the importance of not sharing or trading food with classmates. As a further precautionary measure, if a class has a student with a life-threatening food allergy, parents of classmates will be advised that each student's snack must be free of the life-threatening food allergen. In all classes, all students' snacks must be purchased in stores, commercially prepared and packaged, and contain complete ingredient lists. However, fruits and vegetables are acceptable in the classroom without a life-threatening allergy to the fruits and vegetables.

## **Pesticide Neighbor Notification**

No pesticide applications took place this past year at any of our schools. Individuals may register to receive a written notice within 48 hours prior to a pesticide application. You may request information about the products that were applied, including any warnings that may appear on the pesticide label that pertains to the protection of humans, animals, or the environment. Please contact the Assistant Superintendent for Business at 516-992-7260 if you wish to obtain additional information.

### **AHERA Compliance**

The district's regular maintenance of schools includes asbestos inspections in all facilities; in compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) the district undertakes the following:

- Performs periodic surveillance and three-year inspections for all asbestos building materials.
- Updates the district asbestos management plan.

## **Nondiscrimination Policy**

The Merrick Union Free School District does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, religion, age, sex, disability, sexual orientation, marital status, military status, or genetic predisposition or carrier status in its educational programs or employment.

The Board of Education of the Merrick School District is committed to providing to its students and employees an environment free from all forms of unlawful harassment, including sexual. Any student or employee who believes that he or she has been subjected to unlawful harassment should report the alleged misconduct so that appropriate corrective action may be taken. The Board of Education Sexual Harassment Policy is available at the District Office. The Deputy Superintendent serves as the District Compliance Coordinator for this policy.

## **An Important Part of Community Life**



#### **Get Involved In Education**

For our educational system to flourish, it needs the involvement and participation of all members of our community. Each and every citizen of Merrick has an important contribution to make to the effective functioning of our school district.

## **Community Use of School Facilities**

Nonprofit community groups, whose members are primarily residents of the school district, may use school facilities when available for educational, civic and recreational activities. Applications and information may be obtained from the Office of Facilities at 516-992-7255.

#### **Vandalism Hurts All of Us**

Grounds of all three schools close at dusk, except when being utilized for activities approved by the Board of Education and for which permits have been issued. Persons on school grounds without authorization are subject to charges of trespassing. Acts of malicious damage to school property should be immediately reported to the district office or to the police. State law holds parents or legal guardians responsible for damage to school property.

Vandalism in our schools hurts all of us. Students and teachers lose the opportunity to utilize needed equipment, materials or facilities. The community as a whole suffers, not only because the climate of our schools is diminished, but because it is the community that must bear the financial burden of senseless vandalism. Working together as a community, we can help to put a stop to vandalism once and for all.

#### The Merrick Board of Education

One way to become a part of the educational process is through participation in the meetings of the Board of Education. The seven-member Board serves without pay and is elected by residents to three-year terms of office. The Board generally meets at least once a month on Tuesdays beginning at 7:15 p.m. at the Katherine E. Reif Administration Center. Meetings are listed in the calendar and visitors are welcome.

## **Voting and Registration**

Residents of the district may vote in May on the annual budget, as well as for candidates to the Board of Education. To vote, a person must be a registered voter of the school district or a currently registered voter in Nassau County, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years old and a resident of the school district for 30 days prior to vote. For registration to remain valid, a resident must have voted in a school district election or in general elections at least once in the past four years.

#### **Save Time!**

Residents may register to vote at all district schools on all school days of the school year between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. up to five (5) days prior to the budget vote. Additional information may be obtained from the District Clerk. Phone: 516-992-7240.

## Votación y Registro

Los residentes del distrito pueden votar en Mayo sobre el presupuesto anual y elegir los candidatos de la Junta de Educación. Para que la inscripción sea válida, el residente debe haber votado en una elección del distrito escolar o en elecciones generales al menos una vez en los últimos cuatro años.
